TOPIC: REDUCING THE RISK OF RAGGING

About the Programme:

A special lecture was organised on this day by our college by the Anti-Ragging Cell as an initiative of IQAC. The college invited an eminent guest Shri Rakesh Mujumdar from the Social Welfare Department, who was well acquainted with rising issues of ragging in Colleges/Universities of the district and around. In the presence of IQAC Coordinator Dr.Savita Kotbagi the inauguration of the programme took place. The teaching staff showed their presence and the student's active participation lead the programme towards its success. The resource person spoke about the punishment clauses and shared the information on the websites for help. The IQAC co-ordinator and the NSS Coordinator addressed the students to convey some points stating the purpose of the programme as to:

Punishment Clauses:

Any organisation that doesn't take the necessary precautions to stop ragging, doesn't follow the rules, or doesn't appropriately punish ragging offenders or occurrences is subject to the fines and sanctions outlined in the regulations. Any student or group of students will face one or more of the following permissions if found guilty of ragging on or off campus

- Suspension from attending courses and academic privileges; removal of scholarships and other perks; prohibition from taking any sessional tests or university examinations; or withholding results.
- One-month suspension from the college; Cancellation of admission;
- Prohibition from representing the college in any national or international competition, youth festival, etc.
- Suspension or expulsion from the residence hall; Rustication from the institution for one to four semesters or a comparable period;
- Expulsion from the college and subsequent prohibition from receiving admission to any other institution.
- Fine of up to twenty-five thousand rupees; Imprisonment.
- A fine of up to ten thousand rupees, maybe two years in jail, or both.
- Collective punishment: In order to ensure community pressure on the prospective raggers, the institution will use collective punishment as a deterrence when the students who are committing or aiding the crime of ragging are not discovered.

In the address talk the IQAC Coordinator highlighted on aspects like

Fear and Public Perception

In India, women are generally afraid of violence. A lot of women feel insecure in public places. India's Peace and Security Index reflects this anxiety. This suggests that women's perceptions of safety have significantly decreased.

Comparative Evaluation with Other Nations

India's record on women's safety is worrisome when compared to other countries. For example, although women's safety has improved in many nations, India still has high crime rates. Approximately 88 rape instances are registered every day, according to NCRB data, with many more probably remaining undetected. This presents a dismal image of the safety of women in the nation.

Specialised Support Centres and Helplines

The government has established a number of helplines and support centres to offer prompt assistance: A **24-hour emergency response service for women** in need is the 181 Women Helpline. **One-Stop Shops**: These facilities provide comprehensive medical, legal, and psychological help to women who have experienced assault. **Cybercrime Portal**: A way to report online abuse and harassment that makes it possible for women to get assistance online. Campaigns for Public Awareness.

REPORT: Special Lecture on the

TOPIC: "AWARENESS on WOMEN'S SAFETY IN THE PRESENT SCENARIO and JUDICIAL/LEGAL FRAMEWORK"

A team of women police, from the sub-urban police station, Hubballi, Karnataka visited the college and addressed the students.

Some key points from the advice given by the Women police are as below: Important Legal Clauses

Several significant statutes are part of India's legislative framework for women's safety:

1) The 2013 Act on the Prevention, Prohibition, and Redress of Sexual Harassment of Women at Work: This law requires companies with more than ten workers to establish Internal Complaints Committees (ICCs) in an effort to provide a safe workplace for women.

2) The 2013 Criminal Law (Amendment) Act: It included harsher punishments for sexual offences, including the death sentence for repeat offenders, and was known as the Nirbhaya Act. Additionally, it established new offences including voyeurism and stalking.

3) The 2005 Protection of Women Against Domestic Violence Act: In addition to offering civil remedies to shield women from abuse at home, this statute gives a thorough description of domestic violence. For the protection of women in India, the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) highlights the necessity of improved law enforcement and safety audits. In order to improve women's safety in India, the legal system and judicial remedies are necessary, but actual improvement depends on successful execution and social change.
