ANTI RAGGING CELL REPORT

Activity: Visit and a Special lecture by the PSI and his team, Bendigeri police Station- Hubli

Date: 08/10/2020

A programme was conducted by the Anti –Ragging cell on the 8th of October 2020. The students of the college were very much benefitted by the programme. Shri Shyamrao Sajjan; PSI, police station, Bendigeri-Hubli with his team visited our college and they addressed our students. He gave a lecture on "Antiragging" .The Faculty and student members of our college, specially the anti-ragging committee attended the event.

Dr Sheela Bhaskar, Member Secretary of Antiragging Committee, gave the welcome address, followed by Shri M.D.Mattimani, Principal of our college. He also felicitated the guest speaker Shri Shyamrao Sajjan; PSI, police station, Bendigeri-Hubli.

Later the guest emphasised on the topic's importance and seriousness. He stressed the Honourable Supreme Court of India's definition of "what constitutes ragging." The lecture clarified the role of the institute's anti-ragging committee, senior students' perceptions of ragging, and their participation in preventing ragging.

The same guest also visited to the PUC section and the PU students of our college were also given some instructions regarding the same. Smt Shailashree Imrapur and Shri M.I. Nimbal, the staff of PUC also found the programme to be a useful one. Teachers and students play a significant role in crime prevention and reduction. Teachers must design disciplinary policies, good safety procedures, and incident response plans on a continual basis. Teachers should motivate students to avoid conflict resolution, issue solving, and drug prevention. College violence, drug usage, vandalism, gang activity, bullying, and theft all hinder academics. Various educational programmes, such as those that promote self-control, can help to minimise crime. Educational programmes, that use cognitive behavioural instructional methods, promote self-control or social competence abilities, also helps reduce crime. Institutions in which rules are clearly stated and are consistently enforced participate in prevention and control of disorder and cases such as ragging and any other are not reported.

Academics, gave a vote of gratitude at the close of the programme, which was followed by tea and refreshments.
